The Bentway is opening their Figure Eight Skate Trail and want you to help them celebrate! They will be holding a special event for press on Friday January 5 from 1-3 pm. There will be a short formal announcement, a special demonstration of ice breaking (breakdancing on ice), and then you would be able to get out there and show the press what skating is all about!

The Skate Trail, will officially open to the public on **Saturday**, **January 6** at 11am – WTSC's friend Dylan Moscovitch and his partner Lubov Ilyushechkina will be a part of the opening day events.

On **Sunday, January 7**, The Bentway will host the Mayor's Skate Party from 1-4pm. Complimentary skate rentals and hot chocolate will be available during the fun, family event.

The Skate Trail is located under the Gardiner Expressway right beside the Fort York Visitor Centre (250 Fort York Blvd.) between Strachan Ave. and Bathurst St. It is 220m and stretches from just east of the Visitor Centre to Bastion St.

New STARSkate Coordinator Pam Baleva





Tips For Buying Used Skates

- Wiggle the blades to make sure they are securely attached.
- Make sure the stitched areas of the leather are not coming apart.





- Avoid buying hard plastic skates and adjustable sized skates.
- Avoid buying skates a size larger, as they tend to break down faster and hamper your child's progress and more importantly could create long term foot problems
- Skaters should consult their private coach before purchasing new or used skates.

General Care of Boots and Blades: Proper care of the boots and blades can help them last longer. When removing skates, unlace them enough before taking them off so that the back of the boot does not break down or rip. Blades and soles must be dried carefully with a soft cloth. Remove guards and wipe / wash them. Grit and dirt become lodged in the tracks of the guards. Replace guards occasionally. Cover dried blades with soft blade covers (terry cloth or soft fabric). **We sell new soft blade covers—ask in the office.** Take skates out of bag at home to let them air dry at normal temperatures to avoid rotting and rust.
