StarSkate Levels 1—5 at WTSC

You may notice some changes in the delivery of the StarSkate program in the coming months. The entry level of STAR 1 is designed to meet the exit level of Stage 6 in CanSkate. It is imperative that all skaters beginning STAR 1 have the skills of Stages 5 and 6 in CanSkate. STAR 1 Skills and STAR 1 Freeskate are designed to be achieved within three to nine months of exiting CanSkate. The remainder of the STAR 1-5 program is designed to assist the skater's development in a progressive manner. Skaters may move through the STAR program at their own pace per discipline. Skaters that have already passed some Skate Canada tests will be placed in the appropriate STAR 1-5 testing level by their coach.

What Happens After STAR 1-5?

Skaters may choose to continue in higher levels of the STARSkate program (Senior Bronze, Junior Silver, etc.) or transition into in CompetitiveSkate (Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, etc.). Skaters may also explore ice dancing, pair skating, interpretive skating, or synchronized (team) skating. There are many opportunities for skaters and the best path for athletes to take should be a decision made collaboratively (child, parent and coach).

What's the most important advice you would give skaters: You can do anything you set your mind and heart to!

Tips For Buying Used Skates

- Make sure leather skates give adequate ankle support.
- The leather in the ankle area should not be worn or wrinkled.
- Make sure the stitched areas of the leather are not coming apart.
- Wiggle the blades to make sure they are securely attached.
- If the skates have a liner remove it to check whether the boot has begun to rot inside (due to excessive moisture and improper drying).
- Skaters should consult their private coach before purchasing new or used skates.
